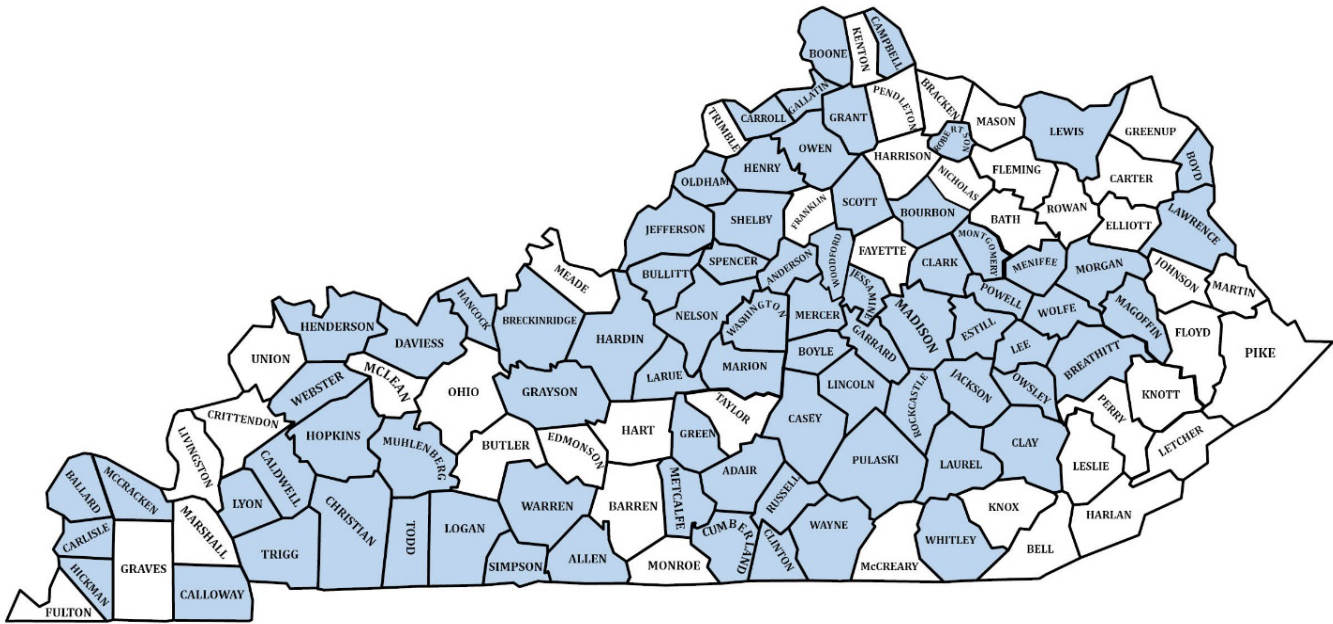


4-H Leadership



A total of 77 Kentucky counties implemented the 4-H Leadership program in order to help young people develop the critical skills necessary to emerge as competent decision makers. A total of 3,170 participants reported that they can now identify their own leadership skills. Through this program, youth not only learn how to recognize specific leadership characteristics, but also how to form relationships and conduct tasks that foster effective teamwork. Over 5,000 noted that they learned what it means to be a team player.

4-H Leadership

- 6,131** Number of youth indicating they have learned to set/accomplish a goal as a result of participating in 4-H leadership programs
- 6,346** Number of youth who have learned to respect people different from themselves as a result of the program
- 1,603** Number of middle school aged youth reporting that they are good at prioritizing responsibilities as a result of participating in the program
- 1,796** Number of middle school aged youth acknowledging that they now know how to achieve a goal as a result of participating
- 1,651** Number of teens reporting being good at planning ahead as a result of participating in 4-H leadership programs
- 1,575** Number of teens who are now good at managing conflict as a result of participating in the 4-H leadership programs
