





UK EXTENSION PROMOTES WORKFORCE READINESS IN KENTUCKY

University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension enhances workforce development in Kentucky through innovative and evidence-based programs that aim to improve the employment skills and workforce readiness of Kentuckians.

4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT WORKFORCE

READINESS PROGRAMS prepare Kentucky youth for tomorrow by incorporating workforce preparation skills in core curriculum areas of agriculture and natural resources; family and consumer sciences; communication and expressive arts; science, engineering, and technology; health and well-being; and leadership. Kentucky 4-H offers workforce development skills through the Communications Contest where youth participate in mock job interviews and other employment skill building activities.

ADULT WORKFORCE READINESS PROGRAMS such as Positive Employability: Preparing for Financial Success, provide clientele with tools for improving personal skills (e.g., communication skills, soft skills, professional etiquette) and resources to be workforce ready. Similarly, Time Well Spent: Productivity Skills for Success, a four-lesson workshop series, aims to enhance participants' time management skills, personal productivity, and ability to establish work-life balance.

VALUE ADDED CERTIFICATION PROGRAMS include Kentucky's Home-based Microprocessing Program, a unique collaboration with Kentucky Department of Agriculture and Kentucky Department of Public Health - Food Safety Branch, that certifies farmers to produce and sell certain acidified and low acid canned foods (e.g., pickles, salsa, tomato sauce, and canned vegetables) using their home kitchens.

BLUEPRINT KENTUCKY provides the CREATE BRIDGES curriculum and training for Extension Agents to provide programs, processes, and strategy development for their local retail, accommodations, tourism, and entertainment businesses. Central to the CREATE BRIDGES curriculum is gaining a better understanding of employee training needs and support, and then developing localized strategies to address them.

INDUSTRY-SPECIFIC CERTIFICATION PROGRAMS

include the Tobacco Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) program that aims to train tobacco growers on best practices for crop, environmental, and labor management. The Produce Best Practices Training (PBPT) program, a joint effort between UK Animal and Food Sciences produce safety team, UK Center for Crop Diversification, and Kentucky Department of Agriculture, aims to enhance produce safety knowledge and practices among growers who offer raw samples at approved farmers markets and roadside stands.

Kentucky Beef Quality and Care Assurance (BQCA)
Certification, a collaboration among Kentucky Beef Network,
UK Extension, and the National Beef Quality Assurance
program, provides hands-on training and online modules
to educate producers on best practices for cattle health,
nutrition, transportation, record-keeping, biosecurity
measures, environmental stewardship, marketability, etc.,
to meet industry and buyer requirements, and strengthen
consumer confidence in Kentucky beef. Junior Cattlemen's
Academy provides high school students with hands-on
instruction on BQCA techniques including basic cattle
handling, vaccine and needle safety, and identification and
record keeping.
